"A New Year's Prayer"

INTRODUCTION

When Paul wrote to the church at Ephesus, he detailed a very encouraging prayer for them. Within that prayer we find four spiritual truths that we can embrace as we enter the New Year. Those truths can in turn become our prayer of commitment to follow after God in 2015.

What was your conception of God growing up?

STUDY QUESTIONS (45 MIN)

God wants us to Know Him and have a relationship with Him Q1. Read Ephesians 1:15-17, Colossians 1:9-10

Paul prayed that God would give the Ephesians and Colossians spiritual wisdom and revelation so that they would know him. What does it mean to you that God wants not just for you to know about Him but to actually know Him personally? Where is the place you feel closest to God? What habits do you need to strengthen in your life to help you consistently see God clearly?

We find our Hope in Christ

Q2. Read Romans 15:13, Titus 1:2, Hebrews 10:23, 1 Timothy 1:1, 1 Peter 3:15

Paul prays for believers to be filled with hope. In today's culture the word hope commonly means wishing for something that might happen. But the word used for "hope" in these passages, *elpis*, means a confident expectation. How is the "hope" referenced in the above passages tied to God's promises? 1 Peter 3:15 tells us to be prepared to give an answer for the hope in you. If asked why you have "hope" (*elpis*) how would you answer?

We find our Riches are from Christ

Q3. Read Ephesians 1:18, Philippians 4:19, 1 Timothy 6:17

God has richly blessed us. This isn't always in material riches, but according to these verses, where do our riches come from? What does 1 Timothy 6:17 tell us is one reason God provides us with all these blessings? Share with the group the last thing you remember that you recognized was a blessing from God that gave you great joy (perhaps a sunset, a baby's smile,

raindrops ...) Take a moment to thank God for the many rich blessings He has given you.

We find our Power through Christ

Q4 Read Ephesians 1:18-21, Philippians 4:13, Colossians 1:11

In Ephesians 1:19-21 Paul describes the nature of the power that God has given us. Is there something that makes you feel powerless? We have all heard Philippians 4:13 that states we can <u>do</u> all things, but what are two specific things that Colossians 1:11 tells us God's power will enable us to do? Which do you need God's power to help you with most in 2015, doing or patiently enduring?

WRAP-UP

A New Year's Prayer

Lord Jesus, my heart's desire is to grow in my relationship with you and know you better this year than I did last year. Fill me with your Holy Spirit and help me grow in my desire to spend time with you and give me a deeper understanding of your desire to have a relationship with me. Colossians 1:9-10 ESV - 9 And so, from the day we heard, we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, 10 so as to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him, bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God.

- 1 Peter 3:15 NIV 15 But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect,
