INTRODUCTION

If you look around in the stores at this time of year you'll notice lots of symbols of love. But despite the candy hearts and romantic dinners, the love the world has to offer pales in comparison to the "New Love" that God offers us. Not only is God's love available to us, it flows through us to others. And Jesus in fact commands that we love one another. STUDY QUESTIONS (45 MIN)

Love serves

Q1. Read John 13:1-5, 12-15

The love Jesus demonstrated, and commands us to express, is selfless. John 13:1-5 tells us Jesus washed the disciples' feet when he knew He was about to depart. What is one thing you would want to do, for those you love the most, if you knew you were going to die tomorrow? What are some things about Jesus washing the disciples feet that made it an important symbol of selfless love? What are some practical ways you can express that same love to others?

Love blesses

Q2. Read Matthew 5:44; Numbers 6:22-27

In scripture, blessing is often paired with cursing (Matthew 5:44). Both reflect our attitudes and intentions toward others. Cursing means to pray against or wish evil upon someone, but to bless is to pray God would cause them to prosper. Using Aaron's prayer in Numbers 6:22-27, find a prayer partner in your group, then slowly and sincerely, pray that blessing over one another.

Love dies

Q3. Read Philippians 2:5-8, John 15:12-14

Most of us will probably not be called on to give our physical life and die for another person, but there are ways we can "die to ourselves" through service. We sacrifice some of what we have or what we want in order to help others. What are some of the ways you could practice the principle of "love dies" by

giving up some of your personal desires for others? Who are the people God brings to mind to whom you could direct that service?

Source of new love

Q4 Read 1 John 4:7-8, Galatians 5:22-23, John 15:9-12

At this point you may realize that you do not naturally possess the ability to love as Jesus commanded us. Thankfully, God has made that love available to us. In each of the above passages, which person of the trinity is the source of that love?

Q5 Read John 15:1-11

Think about a grape vine. What is the relationship between the vine, the branch, and the fruit? How is the branch involved in "fruit production"? Now think about your relationship to Jesus. If he is the vine, you are the branch, and love is the fruit, how is this new love produced through your life? What practices can you develop to connect to and depend on the vine more effectively?

WRAP-UP

One of the changes we experience when we become Christians is a New Love that is unlike the love the world has to offer. This is a love that is manifest in selfless acts of service, an attitude of blessing toward others (even our enemies), and the willingness to sacrifice our lives for others. The source of this incredible love is God himself. When we remain connected to and dependent on Him, that love can flow through us and be spread throughout the world.

John 15:12-14 ESV - 12 "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. 13 Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends. 14 You are my friends if you do what I command you.

1 John 4:7-8 ESV - 7 Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. 8 Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love.

Galatians 5:22-23 ESV - 22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law.

John 15:9-12 ESV - 9 As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love. 10 If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. 11 These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and

that your joy may be full. 12 "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you.
