"How to Hope More in God"

INTRODUCTION

When we survey the world around us we find many who have no hope. Apart from God, hope is little more than wishing or desiring. But for those who trust in God, hope is a vital part of their faith. In this study we look to God's word to understand this kind of hope and to increase our hope in God.

STUDY QUESTIONS (45 MIN)

Basics of Hope

Q1. Read Romans 8:24-25, 2 Corinthians 3:12

The original Greek word used for hope in these passages is *elpis* which means a confident expectation. What are the attitudes in Romans 8:25, and 2 Corinthians 3:12 that naturally result from having a positive expectation based in God? What difference would it make in your attitude if your hope were based on your performance rather than God's power?

Q2 Read 1 Peter 1:3-6, 1 Timothy 4:10

The greatest reason for our hope comes from the promise of eternal life in Christ. What are some ways God demonstrated His great power in 1 Peter 1:3-6? In 1 Timothy 4:10 Paul refers to laboring and striving. When laboring and striving discourage you, what do you do to renew your hope in God?

Investigate God's Promises

Q3. Read Romans 15:4, 1 John 2:25, Philippians 1:6

One way we can increase our hope in God is to investigate His promises. How does the Apostle Paul connect hope with God's Word in Romans 15:4? Consider the promises given in 1 John 2:25, and Philippians 1:6. What are some situations in which these verses would be most helpful in increasing your hope? Share with your group any verses that you have found particularly helpful in sustaining your hope.

Interrupt your False Hopes

Q4. Read Job 8:13-15, Psalm 33:17, 1 Timothy 6:17

What happens when hope is misplaced according to Job 8:13-15? In Psalm 33:17 and 1 Timothy 6:17 we see two examples of misplaced hope. What

are some of the most common things we place our hope in other than God?

Identify God's Faithfulness Q5. Read Romans 4:18, 2 Corinthians 1:10

There will be times when hope seems to defy reason. It is only God's character, and His faithfulness, which enables us to hold fast to our hope in Him. Before his statement of hope in 2 Corinthians 1:10, Paul declared what about God? It is important to remember and declare God's faithfulness to increase our own hope, and the hope of others. Share with your group some of the ways God has shown himself faithful in your life.

WRAP-UP

Our hope is not like the hope of the world, it is a powerful, positive expectation placed on the living God. To help us increase our hope we can investigate God's promises to us in His word, interrupt our false hopes in anything other than Him and identify God's faithfulness demonstrated to us and others.

1 Peter 1:3-6 NIV - 3 Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living **hope** through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, 4 and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade. This inheritance is kept in heaven for you, 5 who through faith are shielded by God's power until the coming of the salvation that is ready to be revealed in the last time.

Philippians 1:6 NIV - 6 being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.

Job 8:13-15 NIV - 13 Such is the destiny of all who forget God; so perishes the hope of the godless. 14 What they trust in is fragile; what they rely on is a spider's web. 15 They lean on the web, but it gives way; they cling to it, but it does not hold.

Psalm 33:17 NIV - 17 A horse is a vain hope for deliverance; despite all its great strength it cannot save.

1 Timothy 6:17 NIV - 17 Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment.

Romans 4:18 NIV - 18 Against all hope, Abraham in hope believed and so became the father of many nations, just as it had been said to him, "So shall your offspring be."

2 Corinthians 1:10 NIV - 10 He has delivered us from such a deadly peril, and he will deliver us again. On him we have set our hope that he will continue to deliver us,
