"A.D. The Bible Continues"- Week 8 "Undeniable: What Even Skeptics Believe"

INTRODUCTION

One undeniable sign of God's power is the transformation of believers' lives. Perhaps the most miraculous transformation occurred in Saul (also known as Paul). As Chapter 9 of Acts begins, we see Saul pursuing Christians, intent on their destruction. But by the end of this chapter he has become the greatest advocate and defender of the faith. It is only through the power of the risen Christ that such a dramatic change is possible. Not only in Saul, but in everyone who calls on the name of the Lord. As we examine his life, we find the kind of undeniable evidence that causes even skeptics to believe.

STUDY QUESTIONS (45 MIN)

A Radically New Mission in Life

Q1. Read Acts 9:1-9, 15-21

Saul began his journey to Damascus intending to bind the believers and return them to Jerusalem for judgment. But the resurrected Jesus stepped into his path and redirected his zeal. He was in fact God's chosen instrument to carry His Name to Gentiles and Jews (v.15) How would you say your first encounter with Jesus redirected your life's path? Put yourself in Saul's place from the time of his blinding encounter until he received his sight, why do you think he didn't eat or drink? When you sense God assigning you a new mission in your life, how do you seek to confirm what you are hearing?

A Total Change of Character

Q2. Read 2 Corinthians 5:17; Acts 8:3; 2 Timothy 2:24-25

The promise of 2 Corinthians 5:17 tells us that in Christ we are new creations. Compare the description of Saul (Acts 8:3) with Paul's advice in 2 Timothy 2:24-25 as he neared the end of his life. If Paul were in fact displaying the characteristics described, then his transformed character would be evident to all who knew him. Who do you know that is an example of the characteristics Paul describes? Which of those characteristics would you most like to see changed in you?

A Change in Personal Relationships Q3. Read Acts 9:19b, 28; Philippians 4:1; 1 Peter 4:3

As a believer, Paul experienced a change in his personal relationships that we too should find. He spent time with those who could teach him more about Christ (Acts 9:19, 28) and developed a deep affection for other brothers in the

faith (see Philippians 4:1). Who we spend our time with often reflects what we choose to do as well. What are some activities Peter refers to that we leave behind in 1 Peter 4:3? Some times leaving those activities behind means leaving old relationships behind as well. Has your faith made any old relationships more difficult to maintain, and if so, what kind of boundaries did you have to establish? What would you say are your most spiritually edifying relationships?

A Willingness to Suffer for Christ

Q4. Read Philippians 3:10; Romans 8:18; 2 Timothy 1:8

As greatly as Saul had heaped abuse on the Christians, he too suffered for his faith. In Philippians 3:10 we see that Paul sought to know Christ and the power of His resurrection, but realized that to do so, he would participate in great sufferings. What is it that made that suffering worthwhile? (see Romans 8:18) Paul invites Timothy, and all believers, to join in suffering for the gospel. What do you consider some modern-day 'sufferings" that we might be called to experience ourselves?

WRAP-UP

A changed life, like that of Saul's, is undeniable evidence of God's power. After his conversion, God redirected Saul to a new mission in life- to spread the gospel. As Paul's heart was changed his character became a reflection of God's character, a change that should be seen in all believers. He developed a deep affection for, and spent time with those who shared his faith. And he willingly accepted great suffering in exchange for the greatest treasure of all, knowing Jesus Christ.

Acts 9:15-21 ESV - 15 But the Lord said to him, "Go, for he is a chosen instrument of mine to carry my name before the Gentiles and kings and the children of Israel. 16 For I will show him how much he must suffer for the sake of my name." 17 So Ananias departed and entered the house. And laying his hands on him he said, "Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus who appeared to you on the road by which you came has sent me so that you may regain your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit." 18 And immediately something like scales fell from his eyes, and he regained his sight. Then he rose and was baptized; 19 and taking food, he was strengthened. For some days he was with the disciples at Damascus. 20 And immediately he proclaimed Jesus in the synagogues, saying, "He is the Son of God." 21 And all who heard him were amazed and said, "Is not this the man who made havoc in Jerusalem of those who called upon this name? And has he not come here for this purpose, to bring them bound before the chief priests?"

2 Timothy 2:24-25 ESV - 24 And the Lord's servant must not be quarrelsome but kind to everyone, able to teach, patiently enduring evil, 25 correcting his opponents with gentleness. God may perhaps grant them repentance leading to a knowledge of the truth,

Acts 9:19b, 28 ESV – 19b For some days he was with the disciples at Damascus. ... 28 So he went in and out among them at Jerusalem, preaching boldly in the name of the Lord.

Philippians 4:1 ESV - 1 Therefore, my brothers, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm thus in the Lord, my beloved.

1 Peter 4:3-4 NIV - 3 For you have spent enough time in the past doing what pagans choose to do--living in debauchery, lust, drunkenness, orgies, carousing and detestable idolatry. 4 They are surprised that you do not join them in their reckless, wild living, and they heap abuse on you.

Philippians 3:10 NIV - 10 I want to know Christ--yes, to know the power of his resurrection and participation in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death,

Romans 8:18 NIV - 18 I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us.

2 Timothy 1:8 NIV - 8 So do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord or of me his prisoner. Rather, join with me in suffering for the gospel, by the power of God.
