"Avoiding A Dead Faith"

James – Doing Church Right #4

INTRODUCTION

As we continue our study in the book of James we come to one of his most recognizable statements, "Faith without works is dead". This verse has been the subject of discussion within the church. If we are saved by grace through faith, why do we need works? What about those who try to "earn" their way to heaven by works? In this study we will consider how we can demonstrate true faith, rather than the "dead faith" James warns us about.

Study Questions (45 MIN)

True Faith is Action

Q1. Read James 2:14-17; Ephesians 2:8-9; 1 John 3:17-18

The word James uses for faith (pistis) refers not only to a belief, but also to a firm assurance or guarantee that something is true. It is not our faith, but what we place our faith in that ultimately must be found true. According to Ephesians 2:8-9 by what have we been saved, and what role does our faith play in our salvation? What does verse 9 tell us about our works? In a life controlled by God, what response would you expect toward those in need? Both James 2:14 and 1 John 3:18 refer to those whose profession of faith is not evidenced in their actions. What are some thoughts, or voices, that contend against your expressing compassion for those in need? How might knowing that God's love and power are guaranteed to you, influence your response?

True Faith is Submitting to God O2. Read James 2:18-19; Mark 1:24; Deuteronomy 6:4

Clearly, James is saying that believing, without submitting to the Lordship of Christ, isn't enough to save you. (James 2:19, Mark 1:24) If your works are not a means of salvation, why does James stress their importance? If believing God is one (Deuteronomy 6:4, James 2:18) is not sufficient to save us, why does James commend those who believe? In what way has your submission to God been tested?

True Faith is obeying

Q3. Read James 2:20-24; Hebrews 11:17-19

James clarifies himself in verse 22, pointing out that faith is perfected or completed by our works. One example of this is when Abraham offered his son Isaac. What does verse 21 say he gained by the "work" of offering Isaac? James says this fulfilled the scripture "Abraham believed God", in other words his actions were the evidence of his faith. What does Hebrews 11: 17-19 tell us Abraham believed about God? How did offering to sacrifice Isaac give the evidence of that belief?

True Faith is for everyone

Q4. Read James 2:25-26; Joshua 2:8-9; Hebrews 11:31

The final example of works as evidence of a true faith was an unlikely one; not only a woman, but a prostitute, Rahab! What message do you think the Apostle James wanted to express to his readers by choosing Rahab to exemplify true faith? Based on her statement in Joshua 2:5, what did Rahab believe about God and how did she display her faith through her works? God calls all of us to a true faith that can be demonstrated through our works. Is there a way you feel God has called you to confirm your faith through action, and how have you responded?

Wrap-Up

James warns us about faith consisting of all words and no action. If we have a true and vibrant faith it will be evidenced in actions that reflect our submission to God. Through our obedience we place our complete confidence in Him, confirming what we believe by the way we live our lives. God may not call on you to sacrifice your son, or risk your own life, but every one of us is called on to live out our faith through submission and obedience as evidence to the world of the God we believe in.

Memory Verse

So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead.

-James 2:17 ESV

Prayer (20 MIN)

Ask your group to pray for you regarding one area where you can apply this study in your life: Pray for your group members' needs:

Challenge: If you find that you have been professing faith but failing to show compassion to those in need, ask God if you need to fully relinguish control of your life so that He can fully express His love through you.

Q1

James 2:14-17 ESV - 14 What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? 15 If a brother or sister is poorly clothed and lacking in daily food, 16 and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, be warmed and filled," without giving them the things needed for the body, what good is that? 17 So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead.

Ephesians 2:8-9 ESV - 8 For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, 9 not a result of works, so that no one may boast.

1 John 3:17-18 ESV - 17 But if anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him? 18 Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth.

Q2

James 2:18-19 ESV - 18 But someone will say, "You have faith and I have works." Show me your faith apart from your works, and I will show you my faith by my works. 19 You believe that God is one; you do well. Even the demons believe--and shudder!

Mark 1:24 ESV - 24 "What have you to do with us [unclean spirits], Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are--the Holy One of God."

Deuteronomy 6:4 ESV - 4 "Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one.

Q3

Read James 2:20-24 in your Bible

Hebrews 11:17-19 ESV - 17 By faith Abraham, when he was tested, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises was in the act of offering up his only son, 18 of whom it was said, "Through Isaac shall your offspring be named." 19 He considered that God was able even to raise him from the dead, from which, figuratively speaking, he did receive him back.

Q4

James 2:25-26 ESV - 25 And in the same way was not also Rahab the prostitute justified by works when she received the messengers and sent them out by another way? 26 For as the body apart from the spirit is dead, so also faith apart from works is dead.

Joshua 2:8-9 ESV - 8 Before the men lay down, she came up to them on the roof 9 and said to the men, "I know that the LORD has given you the land, and that the fear of you has fallen upon us, and that all the inhabitants of the land melt away before you.

Hebrews 11:31 ESV - 31 By faith Rahab the prostitute did not perish with those who were disobedient, because she had given a friendly welcome to the spies.
