INTRODUCTION

As we enter the holiday season, Christmas carols will fill the air. Many of the best-loved carols contain the Gospel message within their lyrics. Even those who have never picked up a Bible can probably recite "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing." Our Christmas series begins this week with a look at the Gospel contained in this classic carol, and the amazing message of hope that the world hears through it. (You can find the lyrics on the back of this study.)

Study Questions (45 MIN)

Jesus came to reconcile sinners to God

Q1. Read Colossians 1:19-22; Romans 5:10; Romans 6:23In the very first verse of "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing" we find a clear message of the purpose of Jesus' birth. "*Peace on earth and mercy mild, God and sinners reconciled.*" Where do you find peace, mercy and reconciliation in the first chapter of Colossians? What does Romans 5:10 tell us results from this reconciliation? What is the alternative to reconciliation for those who haven't been saved "by his blood shed on the cross?" (Romans 6:23)

Jesus came to make God known

Q2. Read Isaiah 7:14; Luke 1:30-35; John 1:14, Mark 8:29

Another important truth of this carol is to identify who Jesus is. "Late in time behold him come, offspring of the virgin's womb... Veiled in flesh the Godhead see, Hail the Incarnate Deity... Pleased as man with men to dwell, Jesus our Emmanuel" The name Emmanuel means God is with us. What did Isaiah prophesy about Emmanuel (Isaiah 7:14) that would uniquely identify Jesus as fulfilling this promise (Luke 1:30-35)? Perhaps the most important question we can ask is "Who do you say that Jesus is?" How did Peter respond to this question in Mark 8:29? If you agree with Peter, what was it that convinced you of this truth?

Jesus came to destroy death

Q3. Read 2 Timothy 1:10; 1 Corinthians 15:55-58

Ultimately Jesus came to give us eternal life, and that meant he had to save us from death. What does Timothy tell us was revealed through the

appearing of Jesus? This is the good news we should be shouting from the rooftops. We have victory over death through Jesus! (1 Corinthians 15:55-57) What does Paul state that our response to this should be? (1 Corinthians 15:58) What changes in your life could this truth make?

Jesus came to transform our lives Q4 Read Malachi 4:2; John 1:4; John 10:10

Finally the joy of the Gospel message is contained in the final verse of our carol. "Hail the Heaven-born Prince of Peace! Hail the Sun of righteousness! Light and life to all he brings, risen with healing in his wings" Reflecting both the Old Testament promise of Malachi and the encouragement of John's Gospel, we find the power of Jesus to transform us. What kind of healing has Jesus brought into your life? John 10:10 tells us Jesus came to give us a full life¹ What would you say are some of the things that reflect a full life? Is there anyone in your life that needs to hear the good news of healing and abundant life?
