True Riches (#5) Ephesians 2:1, 4-5; 1 Corinthians 6:9-11; Titus 3:3-7

<u>1 Timothy 6:6–12, 17-19 (NIV)</u>⁶ But godliness with **contentment** is great gain. ⁷ For we **brought** nothing into the world, and we can take nothing out of it. ⁸ But if we have food and clothing, we will be **content** with that. Job 1:21

Matthew 22:37–38 (NIV) ³⁷ Jesus replied: " 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' ³⁸ This is the first and greatest commandment.

<u>2 Timothy 3:1–5 (NIV)</u>¹ But mark this: There will be terrible times in the last days. ² People will be **lovers** of themselves, **lovers** of money, boastful, proud, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, ³ without **love**, unforgiving, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not **lovers** of the good, ⁴ treacherous, rash, conceited, **lovers** of pleasure rather than **lovers** of God—⁵ having a form of godliness but denying its power...
