Developing Passionate Devotion

<u>Day One</u> – <u>Read John 17:3</u>. When you think of the best life possible, what comes to mind? How has knowing God and Jesus made life better for you? Write down some ways:

Pray - Thank God for changing your life by revealing his love, power, grace and mercy to you. Ask that you will come to know him better and that your entire life would flow from His life in you.

<u>Day Two</u> – <u>Read Luke 9:23-24.</u> Do you want to "follow" Jesus today? *Really?* What "selfish ways" do you need to turn from? What does the cross of self-surrender represent for you today? What part of *your* will are you willing to surrender to really know and do *His* will?

Pray – Thank Jesus for his call on your life. Ask him to forgive you for your divided heart and distracted devotion and give yourself again, afresh to him now. Ask him to come and reign in you and through you today.

<u>Day Three – Read Luke 9:37-56.</u> Being on the Mount of Transfiguration and seeing Jesus in his glory, speaking with Moses and Elijah must have been overwhelming. The Father told Peter to listen, not speak. When we encounter the glory of God, sense his presence and see his work, we need to listen to what God wants to say to us. Peter was more comfortable with speaking than listening. How about you?

Pray – Ask our Heavenly Father to reveal the glory of his son, Jesus Christ to you. Listen to what he says through his Word, and the voice of his Spirit. Are your spiritual eyes open?

Developing Passionate Devotion

1. It Begins with a Response .

2. It Grows with Challenges

6. It Prepares Us for <u>Ministry</u>.
